Captain's Cove Members Vote to partner with Developer

In a Special Meeting of the Members held May 20th at 10:00am at The Marina Club, the Members of Captains Cove voted to partner with the Developer by purchasing The Marina Club, all stock in the Utility Company, and many of the Developers rights. Here are the results of the vote:

Votes for the Proposal

Total Votes <u>FOR</u>	4380
Total Votes <u>AGAINST</u>	236

The deal will still need the approval of the regulatory agencies regarding transfer of the Utility Company stock, as well as approval of Captains Cove Group LLC's plan for reorganization submitted to the Bankruptcy Court.

It is significant to note that the Membership of Captains Cove Golf & Yacht Club passed this proposal without counting the votes cast by the Developer. This is easily the most important issue that the Membership has faced, ever. I thank all of you for the good questions asked, and for keeping things civil in our meetings. While we work on the details of closing the transaction, I hope we can all enjoy another great summer season here at The Cove. The Association Staff and our Volunteers are working hard to make your experience here as enjoyable as possible. In closing, I hope to see you all at Summerbration, July 4, 2009.

The Anglers' Corner, "Angler" Ron Horst

First off, we would like to thank Mr. Lance Stitcher for his many years of reporting at the "corner". The Cove Flounder Tournament this year was a great turn out. We had 82 flounder fishing men, women and youngsters at the rods. Day one of the tournament; the weather was beautiful, the fish were picky and lots of throw backs, but managed to get 14 keepers among all the boats. At the end of "Day One" the leader was a 4lb.12oz. fish caught by Ray Fogal. Sunday, "Day Two" started out very windy but died down by 9:30 am. Again everyone had to move around to find fish, but it was just great to have a day two. At the "Day Two" weigh-in, the top three just about stayed the same except for the Commodore Don LeDuc pulling in a 4lb.9oz. fatty, moving into second place. Again, great time had by all. At the end of the weekend, our standings were as follows: Approximately 37 keepers caught; First place-Ray Fogal, 4lb.12oz.; Second Place-Don LeDuc, 4lb.9oz.; Third place-Chief Rob Giard, 4lb.7oz. And for the Kids; First Place, Nicholas Murphy 2lb.13oz. and Second place, Nicholas Slade at 2lb.8oz. I did not catch a keeper myself, darn kids stole my fish!!!! The flounder bite should stay here as long as the water temperature stays mild.

Then we wait for the hardhead (croakers). We would also like to thank the sponsors: Billy Staples, Nationwide Insurance; B.I.C. Construction, Seahawk Fishing Center, Thornes Marine and the Cove Marina Club.

New at the Corner; Out of the Cove Report as of 05/09.

Off shore: The wrecks are full of tog toug (black fish), with some small sea bass. Ocean City: The tog are at the north side of the getty and from the second and fourth street bulkheads. The flounder fishing is picking up as we report, with a couple stripes ranging from 18 to 36 inches drifting through the inlet. Bayside Chesapeake: Fishing is slow around the Crisfield buoys and will not get hot for a couple more weeks, but the big stripers are in the main channel. Surfing Boys: Starting to pick up nice Black Drum with an occasional striper.

We have a great fishing season upon us and if you are like me, "on the boat, rod in hand and wife at home", HA HA! Lighten up girls, you can catch fish too! Stay Tuned. Stiff lines and busy nets!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!
